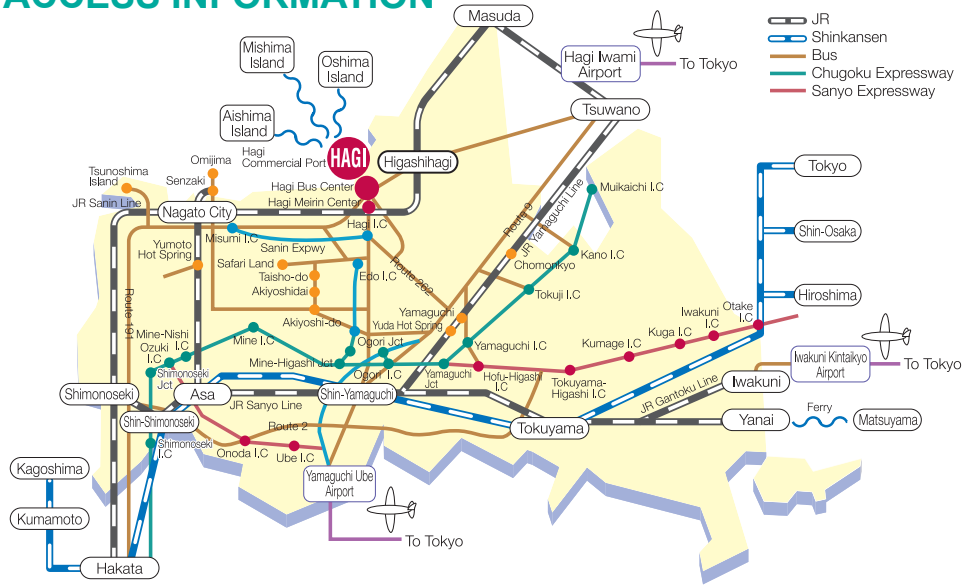


ACCESS INFORMATION

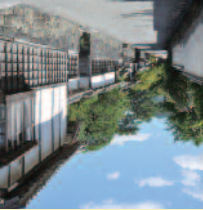
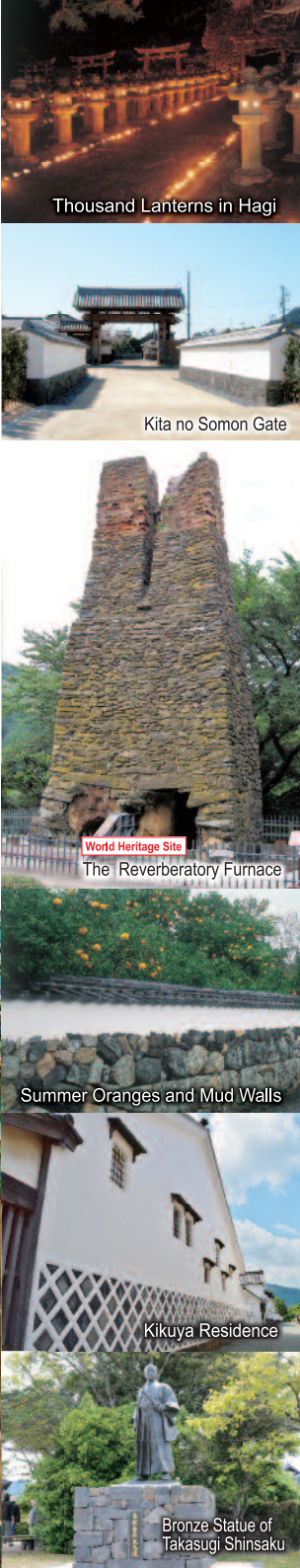

Map of the Hagi Castle Town



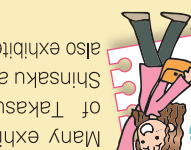
The Hagi Castle Town area, a registered UNESCO World Heritage Site, is a uniquely well-preserved example of a feudal Japanese city. Visitors enjoy walking through the old streets and seeing the old residences of wealthy merchants and upper-class samurai.
